There are four questions below in each of four categories (one point for each correct answer).

At the end, take a single word (**or part of it**) from each of the 16 answers and connect them together to form four new sets of four answers, each with a common theme. Note the questions relating to the themes are not in the same order in the categories. Good luck with those connections – there's another 1 mark for each theme of four you connect correctly, and 1 mark for each theme you identify, so a maximum score of 24.

#### Category 1 – Equestrian Matters

1. What is the married name of the individual who has won Badminton Horse Trials the greatest number of times (six on six different horses)?
2. What kind of anatomical structure is a deep digital flexor or a superficial flexor in a horse?
3. What can be standing or running (though not at the same time)?
4. Which grey steeplechaser competing between 1983 and 1991 won five King George VI Chase and two Cheltenham Gold cup races?

#### Category 2 – Other Sports

5. Which Welsh regional rugby team plays at the Liberty Stadium in Swansea?
6. What is the national emblem on the shirts of the England rugby team?
